As a Kindergarten teacher, I'm using my read-aloud time to check in with students and see how they are feeling. I want to make sure I validate their feelings and encourage them to share if they feel comfortable. I'm using Todd Parr's collection of books that deal with empowering kids to be themselves, to be different, and to understand that we experience a variety of feelings, and ways we can deal with them.
