School-Based Client Consultation, Referral, and Management of Care – Outlines processes related to problem identification, triage, assessment and client consultation, referral, and

In addition, a sampling of published references are listed. General resources and references are presented in Part I. Part II is organized around the Commission's goals and recommendations and presents resources that have specific relevance to each.
